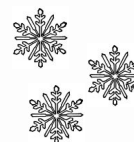

You'll never guess what we will be doing next Father's Day – June 21, 2020! We have been invited to attend the Eyes on Design Car Show, which is held at the Edsel & Eleanor Ford House property in Grosse Pointe Shores, MI.

Now, this is not an ordinary car show. It is an Automotive Design Exhibition. Andrew Sirvio is in charge of choosing the displays and was here at our Museum to invite us to bring snowmobiles! He usually picks motorcycles, but this next show will be different. How could we refuse?

This car show benefits the Henry Ford Health System, the Department of Ophthalmology, and was started 32 years ago. This Department exists to assist and educate the visually impaired, helping them to maintain independence and dignity and live satisfying lives in a sighted world. It also sponsors international research congresses that annually bring together the world's leading vision-related scientists. The show is open to the public and is a show that is about the "beauty of rolling sculpture and the visual delight these vehicles provide those of us with the sense of sight, on the grassy meadow at the Ford House." Snowmobile the Mighty Mac

The Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum in conjunction with The St. Ignace Visitors Bureau are offering a unique experience for antique and vintage snowmobile enthusiasts. On Saturday, Dec 14, 2019, antique and vintage snowmobiles will be driving over the Mackinac Bridge.

Our Featured Speaker this year will be Dallas Fisher, who crossed the Mackinac Bridge on a snowmobile in 1979 with three others on their way from Goodrich, MI to Yellowstone! He will not be crossing the Bridge but will give a presentation during the lunch. (See article below for more information about Dallas Fisher.)

Snowmobiles must be a minimum of 25 years old and have front wheel kits that have a minimum 2" wide wheels and no studs or cleats, will be allowed to drive over the Bridge under their own power. They also will need a current registration or a Michigan Historic Registration sticker. The cost to drive over the Bridge is \$35 which includes lunch at the Little Bear Arena East in St. Ignace.

Participants will line up at the Colonial Michilimackinac parking lot in Mackinaw City. **You must be there by 10 AM** to unload your snowmobile and drive your vehicle North to the Welcome Center. A school bus will drive everyone South to their snowmobiles. The drive over the Bridge will begin at 11 am. Lunch will be served at the Little Bear East Arena, downtown St. Ignace. The cost for lunch will be \$10 each for those who did not pre-register.

There will be a commemorative shirt available at the Little Bear Arena from the Museum staff. Cost for the shirt is \$20.

1979 Mackinac Bridge snowmobile crossing part of epic journey to Yellowstone

"ST. IGNACE, MI -- 2,279 miles. That's how far a group known as the Genesee Sno-Finders traveled via snowmobile in January of 1979.

Embarking from Goodrich on Jan. 6, brothers Dallas and Douglas Fisher and fellow winter enthusiasts Richard Moore and Loren Matthews arrived at Wyoming's Yellowstone National Park on Jan. 13. The trip across the northern part of the United States included an unprecedented crossing of the Mackinac Bridge via snowmobile; something that has been prohibited for most of the bridge's existence.

At least until this weekend (December, 2016) when The Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum in Naubinway and the St. Ignace Visitor's Bureau team up to host an event in which vintage snowmobiles can be driven across the Mackinac Bridge for (almost) the first time.

The origins of the journey began in the winter of 1978. The Sno-Finders were nearing the end of a trip in which the foursome circled the border of the Upper Peninsula. "When we got back to St. Ignace we said what are we going to do next year?" Fisher said. "Out of nowhere Dick said, we're going to Yellowstone." The group spent the next year preparing for the journey. Dallas was in charge of contacting snowmobile clubs along the route while Douglas mapped out a course that took them through the U.P., Wisconsin, Minnesota, North Dakota, Montana and Wyoming.

The foursome arrived at the southeast entrance of Yellowstone outside Cody, Wyoming on Jan. 13. After traveling more than 2,200 miles, the group took a quick drive through the park before coming out the other side and loading the sleds onto a trailer driven across the country by a friend from Clio.

Dallas Fisher is now 79 and no longer rides. He and his brother are the foursome's only survivors."

ASCOA Summer Meeting



The ASCOA (Antique Snowmobile Club of America) summer meeting was held at the Willis Snowmobile Museum in Hopedale, Illinois on July 13 & 14, 2019. The Museum is the result of twenty two years of developing and restoring the building and the collecting of antique and vintage snowmobiles to fill the building by the Russell (Huck) Willis family.

The Museum is chocked full of a wide variety of antique, vintage and a few modern machines along with snowmobile memorabilia such as signs, photos and other snowmobile accessories. A unique feature of the Museum is the use of twenty seven varieties of wood paneling and inlays all coming from the Willis' farm. The Museum is comprised of three floors of snowmobiles on display with the heavy iron on the lower floor. There are almost 150 sleds on display. Future plans are to rotate some of the machines on display as there are probably another two hundred sleds still in storage in the barn.

ASCOA members started arriving on Thursday to visit the Museum and to be involved in preparing for the Summer Meet. By Friday morning there was already a large contingent of members from seven states and Canada on site to view the Museum and visit with each other.

Friday afternoon the group journeyed out to the farm to go through Huck's barn and many storage buildings to view what wasn't in the Museum. The group looked like kids in the candy factory. Alas, nothing was for sale. On Friday night for the Cracker Barrel get together at the Museum, the BBQ grill was fired up for hamburgers and the boiler was going for fresh sweet corn.

The annual membership meeting was held at the Hopedale Community Center which is located close to the Museum and there was a large turnout of members. The annual election of Officers and Directors was held and all current officials were re-elected with the exception of our Eastern Director Ken Robarge who requested to retire prior to the meeting. Ken has been replaced with the election of Bob Mosher from New York. Thanks to Ken for your service and welcome aboard Bob. During the membership meeting two club members were recognized for their support of the ASCOA club. Tony Rolfes was presented with the annual Distinguished Service Award and John Zeglin was presented with the annual Jake Woeckner Award. Congratulations to Tony and John.

After the meeting everyone adjourned to the Museum. The street in front of the Museum had been closed and many club members had brought around fifty machines that were on display. Tim Reiter, our ASCOA merchandise manager as well as Director for Lower Michigan had ASCOA items on sale and sold over \$1300 in merchandise. Tim has many new items on sale. Watch for them on the ASCOA website. Thanks Tim.

Early afternoon the BBQ was again fired up for pork chops "Hmm" and of course more sweet corn was cookin!!! It doesn't get any better. We need to give Dick Hummel a big hand for organizing the Cracker Barrel, pork chops and sweet corn events. Dick also made the early motel arrangements.



The evening banquet was held at the Community Center with sixty eight members in attendance. After the meal the annual fundraising auction was held with Ted Postula from the U.P. of Michigan volunteering to be our auctioneer. Members had brought a large number of fun items for the auction. The auction was a roaring success raising \$3250.00 for the club. Thanks, Ted for a job well done.

In summary, the Summer Meeting was a huge success and a lot of fun with great attendance by club members. ASCOA thanks the Willis family for their hospitably and sharing their wonderful Museum with the club members.

Boa Brotherhood

The Boa Ski Brotherhood is a group of over 60 women and men from across many states and provinces who share a common interest in this peculiar brand of snowmobiles. The group was started to help others find parts. This mission continues today. The Brotherhood offers an opportunity for enthusiasts of this specific brand to share their history, knowledge and parts while having a little fun preserving history through demonstrating the functionality of these classic snow sleds. Each year the Brotherhood gets together in the winter to ride their sleds at any given show/ride in either Canada or the USA at what is known as the "reunion". These reunions are a great way to meet members of the Brotherhood and partake in a little of the Boa Ski spirit

also known as Boa Foolery. Membership to the Brotherhood is about living life to the fullest on a Boa Ski not just about owning one.

Boa Ski History:

Boa Ski Snowmobiles were made in La Quadaloupe, Quebec Canada and sold from 1968-1978. The Boa-Ski 1968 models were simply named A-1 through A-6. In 1969 the models were changed to "Standard 15" or 19 which represented the HP. These were basic models with single tube bumpers and plain black seats. They also offered a "Deluxe 15", 19, 23, 28, 36 which had a wood grain dash, speedometer, double tube bumper with a Boa Ski nameplate, heat pleated red seats and often electric start. In 1970 they renamed their product line again. The "MK II" line replaced the "Deluxe's" and had all of its options and features. Boa Ski also came out with a new 18" wide track model called the Cobra. This Cobra wide track sled was the start of the Boa Ski racing experiment. Boa Ski made a 1970 racer version called a coffin racer because the hood opened to the side, not the front. 1971 was the largest manufacturing year for Boa. The Cobra wide track was still available and a new comer to the product line was the Boa MK 0 or better known as the baby Boa. This was a 2/3rds scale machine with one headlight marketed towards kids and women. In 1972 the company was bought out by Alsport Corp. of Ohio. Alsport was looking to expand their summer recreation vehicle line to include winter machines. In 1973 Alsport/Boa-Ski discontinued the old two eyed round headlight design completely and focused on the new more aerodynamic looking styles (boaski.com.)

Honda White Fox Now On Display, September, 2019

With all of the products the Honda company has made over the years, not many realize they made this snowmobile in 1973. At least 200 were made and most were distributed to dealers in MI and WI. Shortly after that, Honda recalled all of them to be destroyed. (It is said that someone died testing it.) We believe only two machines survived the recall.

The 10hp, 178cc, 2-stroke air-cooled engine is in the rear, mounted horizontally. The rope-start handle is behind the seat. The carb is on top of the engine and a 2 gal. steel fuel tank is ahead of the engine. It has a 14.6 in. track, 2 sets of bogie wheels, motorcycle taillights and handgrips, and a steel tube frame & fiberglass body. It's 79 in. long, 32 in. wide and weighs 227 lbs. It was designed for a single rider weighing less than 150 lbs and would fit in the back of a full-size station wagon.

This machine is owned by Joe Jones, who is a Honda collector. He buys out inventories and sells NOS parts for most motorcycle brands online. Joe's website is www.nospartsnow.com.

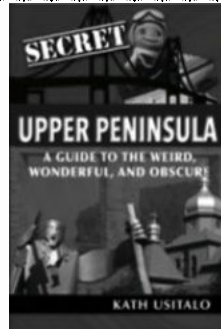

International Snowmobile Congress – June 6-8, 2019

MISORV (formerly MSA) was this year's host for the International Snowmobile Congress, which was held in Grand Rapids, MI at the historic and opulent Amway Grand Hotel. As a bonus for this yearly event, a joint effort headed up by the Ogemaw Hills Snowmobile Club of West Branch, MI, along with leaders of the ASCOA and the Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum, had an exciting display of Michigan's snowmobiles from decades gone by. Several very rare snowmobile, including four made in Michigan, were on display on the upper mezzanine of the Grand Hotel. Word from the staff was that this was the first time in over 100 years that any snowmobiles were on display here.

Some of the rare sleds displayed were:

1. 1967 Scatmobile all seasons snowmobile and summer-use ATV, owned by Matt Beemer of Lapeer, MI.
2. There was also a 1967 Stanaback twin-track, one of two made in Grand Rapids, MI.
3. 1971 Big Boss, made in Ovid, MI. This is one of less than 10 still left and owned by John McGuirk of Ohio.
4. The 1936 Westendorf was made in Saginaw by Fred Westendorf, owned by Dan Boyse. It was made for him to go out farther on the Zilwaukee River to go ice fishing. It has been nicknamed the "Pizza Oven" because that is what it looks like.

There were also 13 fantastic vintage sleds and clothing on display by Doug Lubahn, Tom Hammond, Tim Reiter, Bernie Reid and Brian Lehr.

Thanks to Charlie & Marilyn Vallier for bringing them from the Museum.

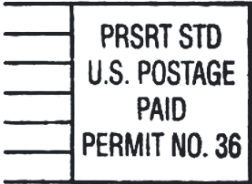
