

Rear Engine Antique Trail Ride #3

The rear engine snowmobile riders returned for the third time prior to the Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum's 26th Annual Ride and Show to ride the old rear engine machines on a 100 mile loop over three days. The ride went from the Museum in Naubinway to Curtis on the first day, then on to Newberry on the second day and returning to Naubinway from Newberry on the third day.



Dave Shope was again the trusty leader of the group, which included five new riders this year. Several of our past riders were unable to make the ride this year. Riders were from Michigan, Ohio, Minnesota and Canada. Ten machines made the ride this year but not without some difficulties. Chains broke, gas tanks leaked, throttle cables broke, carburetors had to be adjusted, parts fell off, tracks were jammed, clutches were boggy but the group was able to overcome most of these problems and complete the three day adventure.

Machines on the ride were Polaris, Arctic Cat, Snowbug, Trailmaker, Polar, Fox Trac, Autoboggan and Eliason. Wyatt Anderson from Goodridge, Minnesota brought along his Kat Kitchen Cutter, which was a welcome addition for our hot dog chef, Bernie Reid. The group stopped and had lunch on the trail each day. Every day we had passing riders stop to see the old machines and to enjoy a hot dog with the group.

As usual Jan McGuirk and Karen Jarema followed the group with the safety sled with its flashing safety light. Charlie Vallier spent most of the first days ride chasing around the area picking up broken machines so that they could be repaired and returned to the challenge. John Ketcher did a great job each day shuttling the group to and from their lodging with the school bus.

Thanks go out to Curtis Fish & Hunt Shop, Neal's Auto Parts and Engadine Schools for their support for our adven-

ture, to Ted & Sherry Postula for furnishing the hot dogs and to Roger & Karen Jarema for bringing all the great snacks. Sherry Postula surprised everyone with leather key chains shaped like the U.P. which she had made for everyone on the ride - very cool!

It was great to see how everyone pulled together to jump in and fix the various problems and create a lot of fun doing so. After the ride, everyone was already excitedly talking about plans for next year. See you then.

The Night Ride and Bonfire is a family event, with 60 snowmobiles (and a Tucker SnoCat) that went



2018 Top of the Lake Show & Ride Celebrates the Plaisted Expedition 50th Anniversary

he Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum first opened in July, 2007. The Museum has never bought snowmobiles for display, but Charlie is always looking for the odd ones for his collection. Somewhere around 2009 Charlie found a 1971 Snobyke for sale in Green Bay, WI. That wasn't too far from us, so we made the trip there and returned with a cute little machine we had never heard of. I did some research on it and found out Walt Pederson made 13 of these. I also discovered he was one of the

members of the Plaisted Polar Expedition! Hmmm,

there must be more to this story...

I did a little investigative work and found Walt's phone number. I wanted to go right to the source and I actually was able to talk to Walt Pederson! He lived in Minnesota and had some of his books that he wrote, titled "The Adventures of Little Lady", which was the story of Walt's snowmobile on the Expedition, called "Little Lady", written for children. I was able to order some for the museum to sell. He also said he had a box of the MRE food that they took on the trip that they were testing for NASA. He did send me some great photos, postcards made about the trip, a dvd of "To the Top of the World" about the trip,

and articles, which we framed and put up in the original Museum. I did call him one other time after that to get some more "Little Lady" books, but he was on his way to California so I wasn't able to get some. Unfortunately, I didn't have any more contact with Walt after that.

Fast forward to 2015 - I read that Walt has passed away. That was heart-breaking for me. Another piece of history and a great story was possibly gone. We had been so busy with our new and expanding Museum building, I didn't do any more research about the Expedition. In Nov. 2016, out of the blue, we got a call from Tim Pederson, son of Walt Pederson! He had some of his dad's items from the trip and wondered if we would be interested in seeing them. Yes!! Tim and his sister, Cathy, arrived with a trunk of Walt's that hadn't been opened since the trip ended. Charlie had to pry it open (drum roll please). Next thing we knew there were pieces of Walt's clothing spread out for all of us to see. With temperatures up to -70 degrees on the trip, it was hard to imagine that even that amount of clothing would keep him warm. Tim and Cathy left a few of the items with us to display. They told us that just that day they had listened to an audio tape Walt had made of the conversation the day they were at the North Pole and the Air Force plane flew over to verify their location! They each had tears in their eyes as they were talking about this. Tim and Cathy headed back home, determined to do some more research and work on reproducing the books and other memorabilia about the trip.

Tim and Cathy returned to the Museum in February, 2017 with more display items for us! They happened to be here during our Show week and had a great time talking to everyone about their father and the trip. That was when we realized it would be the 50th anniversary of the Expedition in 2018, so we asked them if they would be the speakers at our 2018 Feb. Show and the 1968 Ski Doo Olympique would be the Featured Sled. They immediately agreed to be the speakers, which was a huge success! While they were here for our February, 2018 show, they invited us to the 50th celebration of the Plaisted Expedition, which will be held on the date the four members made it to the North Pole – April 19th, in Duluth, MN. Families from each of the members of the team on this Expedition will be there. This trip is a story from history that needs to be retold!

50th Soo I-500 & 5th Show & Vintage Lap – Feb 3, 2018

he Museum was very proud and excited to be a part of the 50th year for the Soo I-500! For last year's Memories at the Mile lap we had 67 antique and vintage machines make the mile lap before the start of the official race. We had a feeling this year would have more, but the I-500 committee told us we had to limit it to 70 machines due to the number of events they wanted to have before such a

memorable year's race. That morning, snowmobiles kept coming, Ryan Blain, vintage lap participant, had 40 flags to distribute to anyone who wanted to carry a flag around the track in memory of a veteran. Needless to say, the I-500 committee was so impressed, they let all 97 machines make the lap. What an amazing site to behold!

To add to the memories, there were several former I-500 racers participating in our event. One machine that David Schark brought was a 1971 Arctic Cat King Kat 793 driven by Tim Mazariz. Tim was the fastest qualifier at the first I-500 in 1969 on a 744 Arctic Cat Panther. The machine Tim drove this year at the Soo was his original sled. He took 10th place with this sled after starting 49th at the I-500 in 1971. Tim is now 73

years old and lives in AuGres, MI in the summer and Englewood, Fla in the winter months.

Roger Griner originally raced in the 1970-75 races and he made the lap on his original 1971 Polaris TX machine. Also making the lap was Roger Houle on his 71 King Kat 800; Jeff & Penny Johnson riding I-500 73 Arctic Cat SnoPro and a 2005 Firecat; Terry Spencer on his 1986 El Tigre; and Steve Bishop on his 1973 Polaris Starfire, which raced in 1976.

After the lap, all entries lined up their machines in the parking area for everyone to view. The smiles, stories, and people were plentiful. I wish the 50 years of memories that were float-

ing around that day could be bound into a book. All of us at the Museum were so proud to be able to help former racers relive old memories and others make new memories! A book of photos by SpeedShot Photography is now available.

2nd Annual Snowmobile the Mighty Mac - Dec 16, 2017

Dec 16. 2017 started out as a very cold day (6 degrees), but once the 104 snowmobiles lined up for the 2nd annual Snowmobile the Mighty Mac, the cold was the second thing on everyone's mind. The first thing was how exciting it was to be doing something beyond the ordinary and also a part of history in the making.

Leading the pack was 80 year old Jim Langley, who drove here from Denver, Colorado to participate as the Grand Marshall. Jim and his friend, Clark Dahlin (who has passed away) made a historic Vancouver to Maine Transcontinental trip on 1967 Polaris Colts in 1966! The story can be found in "The Legend of Polaris" book, pages 52-53. Their machines were

specially equipped from the Polaris factory with brake lights, windshield wipers, a Minnesota license plate, turn signals and wheel kits to make them legal to travel through each state. On their way through Michigan, they had to cross the Mackinac Bridge, making them the first to cross on snowmobiles. Louis Leveille was manning the toll booth that day and he remembers charging them \$1.50 each, the motorcycle rate. (Louis came to the lunch to meet Jim again.) The pair traveled on to Portland, Maine to finish the 4,018 mile trip in 24 days. For Jim to be making this Mackinac Bridge crossing again, 51 years later, was a very emotional experience for him. "It was one of the best days of my life!" He was kind enough to autograph the Legends of Polaris books and snowmobiles for the drivers that day.

There were a few breakdowns along the way, 96 officially finished the trek across the 5-mile long suspension bridge, which stretches over Lake Huron and Lake Michigan and connects the Lower Peninsula to the Upper Peninsula. All drivers and cheering fans were offered lunch at the Mackinac Grille in downtown St. Ignace.

After lunch awards were handed out. Monica Dohmen was introduced to explain how the Jim Langley adventure story began. Her friend, Mitch Magnusson, found this 1967 Polaris Colt that made the Transcontinental Trip on property he purchased and recognized it. As a child, he was in Roseau MN when Jim and Clark drove through there. Mitch ended up in a picture taken with them and remembered the extra taillights and other special features on the machines.

Mitch told his friend, Monica, about his find and she did an amazing amount of research to uncover the story behind it. They contacted the original owner, Jim Langley, contacted him and asked Jim to come on our Bridge Crossing as the Grand Marshall. Jim was so excited, he drove here from Denver, CO to speak to the 150 gathered about his adven-

tures and how the Transcontinental Trip idea began.

Two brave women who also made the trip across the Mackinac Bridge were introduced at the lunch presentations. One was Christy Healy whose husband, Carl, and two of his friends made the trip last year. Carl passed away in June, 2017. Christy and her friend, Jerry Cooper, decided to make the trip this year in memory of Carl! The other woman was Betty Redman, who drove across with her daughter and son-in -law, in memory of Betty's late husband, Brad. Brad always told Betty to conquer her fears. Betty also made a very generous donation to the Museum! We are honored to be a part of so many great stories! It sounds like we will see them next year, too.

Next year's date to Snowmobile the Mighty Mac is Dec. 15, 2018. Lunch will be at the St. Ignace Little Bear Arena. Registration will be online through the St. Ignace Visitor's Bureau. See you on the Bridge!

Museum receives Operational Support Grant

The Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum has been awarded a grant of \$11,250.00 for Operational Support from the





offairs Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs (MCACA) and the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA – ART WORKS). The grant was awarded through the MCACA peer review process and was one of approximately 310

applications to compete for the Operational Support Grants by MCACA for the fiscal year 2018 funding.

The grant is for Operational Support for costs associated with the operation of the museum. It requires a 1:1 match and will help the museum to leverage \$11,250.00 of support from its annual income and the many donations received from supporters. In particular the Museum has received grants from the Graymont Community Economic Development Fund and the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians. It has also received significant donations from the Antique Snowmobile Council of America, The Midwest Vintage Snowmobile Shows, Inc. (Waconia), many snowmobile clubs, its internal \$1,000 Challenge program and many Museum members.

The MCACA peer review process allows for each grant application to be competitively considered by a panel of instate and out-of-state arts and culture professionals. This ensures the taxpayers, who support this project through legislative appropriations, and all other visitors or residents in Michigan will have access to the highest quality arts and cultural experiences.

Museum receives a grant from Enbridge Energy

Alex Iseri, Director of the Mackinac Economic Alliance (MEA) and Emma Cook, Analysist, Community Development of Enbridge, were at the Museum on Dec 18, 2017 to make a presentation of a \$4500 check. This is a result of the grant that Alex and the MEA worked on, making it possible for us to purchase video-conferencing equipment. This equipment will be available for large group meetings in our meeting room or smaller groups will be able to use it in our new, sound-proof Library. Call the Museum for availability and fee.

St. Ignace Snowmobile/Tractor Show

The snowmobile/tractor show will be held **Sept 7 & 8, 2018**, in conjunction with the Owosso Antique Tractor Parade & Show in St. Ignace, MI. In addition this year, the **Antique Snowmobile Club of America** will be holding their Summer Meeting in conjunction with the snowmobile show. ASCOA members will have their antiques on display inside the Little Bear Arena, along with the snowmobiles on display for the Museum Show. The ASCOA holds their Summer & Winter meetings in different areas of the Midwest each year and have chosen this show to hold their Summer meeting this year.

1400+ tractors were at this show last year, so we are asking for the snowmobiles to come to the Little Bear Arena on Thursday between 3:00 and 8:00 or very early Friday morning to avoid the congestion in town on Friday morning. Snowmobiles will be displayed inside the Arena and the tractors will be outside. This is going to be a fun award event and all snowmobiles are welcome!

The show had 950+ machines for their ride on Sat., a swap meet, with a banquet, very interesting speakers and an auction on Sat and concluded with races on Sunday. The Museum brought 2 Merc rockers for the auction, painted for this





event. The Waconia Committee ended up donating the money they received from the auction back to our Museum! We also were able to bring the Twin Track and 69 Prototype back to the Museum to keep on display for 2 years. Thank you Steve & Alan!






